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Upcoming Clinical Quality Medical Record Collection

Health Plan of San Mateo (HPSM) is partnering with Episource, which was acquired by HPSM's contracted vendor Optum, to collect medical records. The purpose of this clinical record review is to search for the presence of documented ICD-10 diagnoses not previously reported to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS). Your compliance with this medical record collection ensures that HPSM can report complete and accurate data about your patients to CMS.

A representative from Episource will contact your office to provide you with a list of records for collection and will work with you to determine the most efficient method for record collection. Innetwork providers are obligated to abide by Section 164.506(c)(4) of the HIPAA Privacy Rule, which permits medical providers to disclose patient medical information without a signed authorization from the patient. In addition, HPSM's contract stipulates that requested medical records be submitted at no charge.

You will receive a call and fax from Episource to schedule the medical record retrieval. The items listed below are the components requested, if applicable, for all dates of service for calendar years 2023 - 2024:

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- Demographic/Face Sheet
- History & Physical
- Consult Notes
- Progress Notes
- Vitals & Lab Results

Collection options include:

- Electronically available (preferred) If your practice uses Electronic Medical Records (EMR), the vendors will work directly with you prior to the visit to determine the most efficient and secure method of information transfer.
- If the documents are not available in an electronic format, the vendors will work with your office to provide different methods to obtain the requested records.

- **Operative Reports**
- Procedure Reports
- Problem List
- Signature Log
